Recent News

On Monday 20th March, the IPCC published their AR6 Final Report. No real new data – more of a synthesis.

Here's a **<u>BBC report</u>** summarising the five things we learned.

It's been described as another 'Final Warning' to the world. In the next decade, we will now almost certainly pass 1.5 degrees of warming over pre-industrial levels – which was the 'safe limit' agreed in Paris in 2015. We will also sail past 2 degrees, and many scientists are predicting we're on track for 4 degrees or more.

The amazing Dave Borlace has just released this excellent short summary of the report in "Just Have a Think." Do give it a watch.

Is anybody listening, we wonder?

The poorest households are already under stress; now rising both food and energy prices threaten a public health emergency.
